Chermside Forum

Australian Authors were the focus of Chermside Forum in the month of March 2025.

The authors were Josephine Moon, Jane Gleeson-White and Banyo Patterson. Most well know is Andrew Barton (Banjo) Patterson, who was a poet, solicitor, journalist and soldier. His legacy lives on in Australian literary culture.

Josephine Moon, successful author of 8 books, lives in Cooroy and tackles complex social issues in the community. For example, one of her books "The Wonderful Thing About Phoenix Rose", is about a neurodivergent woman living in a neurodivergent family.

Jane Gleeson-White's books are about literature, economics and the natural world. Her book "Double Entry Bookkeeping, How the Merchants of Venice Shaped the Modern World" is an international best seller. This book explained how double entry bookkeeping allowed merchants to actually measure the worth of their business.

Great meeting, enjoyed by all.

Gigi has vast knowledge and has worked in a wide range of management committees and boards in the areas of advocacy, disability, mental health and multicultural organisations in direct service delivery and organisational support.

It was a fun filled day, with a lot to learn and plenty of hints and tips to make a grant application successful.

Many Local Government Councils (eg Brisbane, Ipswich and Redland) offer free training programs to assist Not for Profit and Community groups.

It was also a fabulous opportunity to promote Forum in the wider community.
